

**Priorities for Actions and Funding for Responding to Threat of COVID-19
for People who are Experiencing Unsheltered Homelessness**
(Note: Not in an order of priority, actions and funding are likely needed across all of these areas.)
Rough Draft 3-12-2020

- 1. Establishment and operation of auxiliary and additional spaces for sheltering people and to accommodate social distancing or self-isolation protocols**
 - Homelessness services organizations need to consult with public health officials to differentiate and define their roles in supporting strategies ranging from social distancing to quarantine.
 - Need funding for costs for acquiring/leasing sites and for staffing and operating them in alignment with recommended practices per <https://www.hudexchange.info/resource/5985/infectious-disease-toolkit-for-cocs/>
 - Consider wide range of options, from community centers, faith facilities, vacant stores, sprung structures, motels, other appropriate sites
 - Need to review and likely waive some policies, regulations, and restrictions on use of funding to make such uses and quick action possible

- 2. Supporting exits from temporary sheltering facilities when people no longer need to be there, when it is time to close them down, and to avoid discharges back into unsheltered homelessness**
 - Funding for staff and services and financial assistance – with focus on rapid rehousing, problem-solving, and access to existing supportive and affordable housing units

- 3. Equipping organizations with medical supplies and equipment, hygiene and cleaning supplies and equipment, etc... necessary to support personal hygiene practices, sanitation at existing and new facilities, and social distancing and self-isolation practices**

- 4. Training for outreach and encampment engagement staff**
 - Including hygiene and safety protocols, but also referral processes into existing and new sheltering facilities and into health care services, facilities, and medical care

- 5. Training for staff working in existing and new sheltering facilities**
 - Including hygiene and safety protocols, but also referral processes into other programs and into health care services, facilities, and medical care
 - See <https://www.hudexchange.info/resource/5985/infectious-disease-toolkit-for-cocs/> for helpful information

- 6. Enhancing connections between homelessness services systems and public health system**

- May need to consider designating specific staff positions to focus on coordination, information exchange, referral processes, etc...

7. Strengthening and refining coordinated entry processes and policies to address medical crises and to help contain spread of infection

- Changes may need to be made in prioritization processes to: address populations most vulnerable to COVID-19 (e.g., older adults, people with most relevant underlying health conditions); facilitate exits from temporary facilities that need to be closed and avoid discharges back into unsheltered homelessness; prioritize people currently unsheltered; and other strategies
- May need to designate specific staff to determine these changes and to educate providers
